Classes Offered

Class 1: Leadership I: Strategies for Company Success

This 2-day NFA course focuses on basic leadership skills and techniques needed to improve command and management effectiveness. It addresses techniques and approaches to problem-solving, identifying and assessing the needs of subordinates, running meetings and decision-making.

Completion of this class meets the requirements for course FRS2062 within the KCTCS Fire Science Technology Degree Program

Class 2: STICO- Strategy and Tactics for Initial Company Operations (NEW COURSE)

This 2-day NFA course is designed to meet the needs of company officers responsible for managing the operations of one or more companies during structural firefighting operations. STICO is designed to develop the management skills needed by company officers to accomplish tactics at structure fires.

Class 3: MCTC-D: Managing Company Tactical Operations-Decisionmaking

This 2-day NFA course is designed to meet the needs of fire officers and crew leaders with responsibilities of managing the operations of one or more companies in structural firefighting operations. This includes preparation for response, decision-making and tactical

operations. The foundation of the course is to provide application of concepts and development of skill.

Completion of this class meets the requirements for course FRS2062 within the KCTCS Fire Science Technology Degree Program

Class 4: ADFR: Arson Detection for the First Responder

This is a 2-day course that will be held on both Saturday and Sunday. This course is the National Fire Academy's "Arson Detection for the First Responder." This classroom delivery will cover many phases of initial fire scene investigation with emphasis on the firefighter's responsibilities in arson detection.

Completion of this class meets the requirements for course FRS2074 within the KCTCS Fire Science Technology Degree Program

Class 5: PICO- Preparation for Initial Company Operations (NEW COURSE)

(Formerly Managing Company Tactical Operations: Preparation (MCTO-P))

This 2-day NFA course is designed to develop a better understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a Company Officer in preparing their company for incident operations. This course is designed for company officers, acting company officers, or senior firefighters responsible for the management of a single fire company at an emergency incident. It benefits those who are responsible for company readiness, personnel safety, and leadership as it relates to company operation.
